Abstract (en)

[origin: WO2007144184A1] To improve playing feel, a shoe (i) for foot operation of a bass drum in a drum kit has a reinforcement (6) and an abrasion protection (7) for the shoe upper (3), with the reinforcement (6) being arranged in the region of the toe joints in the position of use and the abrasion protection (7) being arranged in the region of the big toe in the position of use. A shoe (10) for foot operation of a hi-hat in a drum kit is characterized in that the shoe (10) has a convexly curved roll-off face (16) in the rear heel region, with the roll-off face (16) extending into the region below the foot in the position of use in order to assist the roll-off movement when playing the hi-hat.
