Abstract (en)

[origin: EP2151450A1] Method for processing microbiologically produced, non-polar, cyclic oligopeptide, comprises extracting entire fermentation broth to the microbiological production process using a liquid extractant that contains ether and is immiscible with water at 25[deg] C, where the amount of extractant is sufficient to form a two-phase system together with the total fermentation broth. An independent claim is included for crystalline cyclosporine A-methyl-tert-butylether-solvate having a peak (2 theta angle) comprising 7[deg] +- 0.1[deg], 8.2[deg] +- 0.1[deg], 11[deg] +- 0.1[deg] and 20.5[deg] +- 0.1[deg] by x-ray powder diffractogram, preferably additionally comprising 7.3[deg] +- 0.1[deg], 11.8[deg] +- 0.1[deg], 13.3[deg] +- 0.1[deg] and 16.5[deg] +- 0.1[deg]. ACTIVITY : Immunosuppressive; Antidiabetic; Antipsoriatic; Antiarthritic; Antirheumatic; Antiinflammatory; Anti-HIV; Neuroprotective; Nootropic; Antiparkinsonian; Cytostatic. MECHANISM OF ACTION : None given.
