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(54) Process for producing 5-aminopentanoate empolying a recombinant microorganism

(57) The present invention concerns a method for the biological preparation of 5-aminopentanoate comprising culturing a microorganism genetically modified for

the bioproduction of 5-aminopentanoate, wherein the microorganism comprises a metabolic pathway for conversion of lysine or 2-oxoadipate into 5-aminopentanoate.


